# The Good Character Quality of George Müller



**Definition of Faith:** A strong belief and unshakable confidence in God.

**Bible Verse:** "If you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it will obey you" (Luke 17:6).

## Materials

- ❖ Copy of the crown, strip, and opal jewel labeled "faith" on page 64 for each child (use heavy white paper or card stock; if you do not wish to have the children color their crowns, use heavy yellow paper or yellow card stock)
- ❖ Scissors
- ❖ Crayons or colored pencils
- ❖ Stapler
- ❖ Tape or glue

## Steps to Follow

1. Introduce the character quality of faith, which describes George, and discuss its meaning with the children. Read aloud the Bible verse above.
2. Have the children color and cut out the opal labeled "faith." (Because it is an opal, tell them they may want to color it milky white or pastel.)
3. Have the children color and cut out the crown and strip. Read aloud the following Bible verse: "And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away" (1 Peter 5:4).
4. Have the children tape or glue the opal to the crown. Then have them staple the strip to the crown and put it around their heads. This will serve as their "thinking cap" about faith.
5. Ask the children, "How did George show faith in his life through his words and actions?"
  - ❖ He had faith that God would provide the money to build an orphanage.
  - ❖ He had faith that God would provide for the needs of every orphan in his care.

- ❖ Even though there was no food for the orphans for breakfast, he prayed and thanked God for what they were about to eat.
6. Ask the children if they know someone—a parent, neighbor, or friend—who demonstrates faith in God in their lives. Have them tell the class about this person.
  7. Have the children sing the character song “We Have Faith in God” on page 65. (This song is sung to the tune of “Do Your Ears Hang Low?” If you have the CD for George Müller, you can have the children follow or sing along with this song. At the end of the CD, there is a solo piano accompaniment, which the children can sing along with as well.)
